Welcome: Icebreaker – What is the best gift that you have ever received?

Study Context: This week's study guide revolves around the ideas of tithes and offerings in the church service. Here are a couple of key Old Testament passages that can help you navigate the discussion of tithing.

Genesis 14:18-20 / Hebrews 7:4-9: These passages describe Abraham's encounter with Melchizedek. Abraham offers 1/10 of all his wealth to this Mysterious king of righteousness who presides over the city of Salem (peace, *Shalom*, Jeru*salem*). The author of Hebrews writes that Abraham, when he does offer 1/10 of his wealth to a higher authority is modeling a giving pattern to a king who represents God Himself.

Exodus 23:19, 34:26; Leviticus 27:30: These are passages that echo God's desire to see the first fruits – or the "fat cuts" – of all things to be dedicated to the Lord.

Numbers 18:8-32: The tithes dedicated to the Lord in these passages are designated for offerings and the funding of *the unique work of the Levites and the High Priest of the Temple*.

Deuteronomy 14:22-29; 26:1-14: The tithes dedicated to the Lord in these passages are similarly designated for ceremonial offerings, *a celebratory meal*, and a reserve for the 3rd year to give to the poor.

Scholars debate whether there are 3-4 tithes that add up to 23% or whether the same tithe is used for all expenditures – arguing that tithes could've served different purposes given that Numbers was written during the wandering of Israel and Deuteronomy prepared the nation to enjoy a permanent land. Regardless, pay attention to how God might be calling you toward a deeper relationship with Him through practices of <u>generosity</u>!

What's Going on This Week

This week, Pastor Danny brought us into the seventh week of our series titled *A Church that Pleases God*. Pastor Danny directed our attention to the story of Cain and Abel in *Genesis 4:1-6* to discuss that one of the main reasons we **gather** is to present our gifts and offerings to the Lord through His church. Pastor Danny explains that throughout the scriptures, money is nothing more than a tool that God has given us to bring glory to Him. As you read this study guide, pay close attention to your heart when it comes to the topic of giving.

Word #1: Challenge Your Perspective of Giving Your First Fruits (15 – 25 minutes)

Primary Texts: Genesis 4:1-6; Malachi 3:8-12 – In the very first story of fallen humanity after Adam and Eve, the scriptures confront us with a passage about generosity. While it is not explicitly stated, Abel's offering is accepted because he presents the "fatty portion" of his "firstborn". The assumption that follows is that Cain held back the "first fruits" of his offering and was therefore not accepted. Malachi, the very last book of the Old Testament, suggests that when we do not bring our offerings to the Lord, we are robbing him, taking what is already His, and we are also undermining our relationship of trust for God. How might your giving practices change if you came to the Lord in a posture like Abel looking to offer the "fat cut" of whatever God brings your way? What stands out to you the most about the Malachi passage?

Host Tip: Allow the lessons from scripture here paint a beautiful vision of what life could be like if we let go of our resources and learn to trust the Lord. Leave these questions intentionally open-ended so that the Lord may fill in the blanks through their imagination.

Word #2: Challenge Yourself to Grow in Generosity (15 – 25 minutes)

Primary Texts: Matthew 25:14-30; Mark 12:41-44; Luke 16:1-15; John 3:16; Acts 4:32-35; Romans 8:32; 2 Corinthians 8:1-15 – Listed are scriptures that reveal (1) Jesus' teachings on money and wealth, (2) the early church's treatment of money, and (3) a reminder that the greatest gift we have received is the gift of Jesus Christ. Which of Jesus' teachings about money in the gospels stand out to you the most and why? What might it look like for your Life Group to become like the early church and meet each other's needs on a deeper level? How might you be able to continue practices of generosity throughout the week and in the context of your Life Group moving forward?

Host Tip: There are 3 specific challenges that were given to us as a church. Allow yourselves to discuss these and then continue to brainstorm new methods of participation in the gospel message moving forward.

- Pray for the Unfolding Events in the Russia Ukrainian crisis.
- Pray that the Holy Spirit would continue to inspire us to surrender ALL to Jesus.
