Week 1 The Sun Stands Still

Joshua 10:1-15 God leads the way for us.



After 40 years, the Israelites are finally done wandering and are ready to follow God into the Promised Land. Throughout their journey, there will be many trials and battles, but we have to remember that "God leads the way for His people." One of those battles along the way takes place when God does the impossible for His people – He causes the sun to stand still! If God leads us somewhere and calls us to do something, He will always provide a way for us to succeed. We might not always see how we can accomplish what God has called us to, but we have to know that when God leads us, He will provide.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. What was the best part of your week?
- 2. What stood out to you in today's story?
- 3. How many years had the Israelites wandered in the wilderness? (40 years)
- 4. What was supposed to happen to the city of Gibeon? (it was going to be destroyed)
- 5. Why did the 5 kings want to destroy it? (Gibeon had made a treaty with Israel)
- 6. What did Joshua do when the people of Gibeon turned to him for help? (He brought the whole army to help them)
- 7. How did God help the army when they attacked the 5 kings and their armies? (God sent a hail storm when the armies tried to run away)
- 8. What did God do that showed He was with Joshua and his army? (He listened to Joshua's prayer and made the sun and moon stand still for an entire day)
- 9. This story shows God doing the impossible, how can you trust God to lead you through whatever He calls you to?
- 10. Has God ever shown Himself to you in a miraculous way?

BONUS ACTIVITY: True or False

Materials needed: list of true/false facts

- To introduce this activity, say the following:
- We are going to play "True or False"
- I'm going to call out a powerful thing.
- I'll also call out a measurement of how powerful it is.
- If you think it is true, go to this side of the room.
- If you think it is false, go to that side of the room.

WEEK 2 David is Chosen to be the King 1 Samuel 16:1-13, 2 Samuel 7:8-16

God tells us about our King.

PROLOGUE:

God's Story continually reveals more about His plan to save us and this week we get to look at more about His plan as He reveals who He has chosen to be king. God chose to make David King, someone seemingly young, week, and powerless to do His work; but God chose David because of his heart. And through David, God made a promise that David's descendants would reign forever. Later we learn that one of David's distant descendants was Jesus who reigns on the throne forever as king of the entire universe! Even in the Old Testament, God is telling us about our King through His promise to King David. He is always leading us and guiding us back to our

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 3. Who was Samuel looking for in the story? (the person he was supposed to annoint for the
- 4. Who was that person in the end? (David) What was he doing when Samuel found him? (taking care of his dad's, Jesse's, sheep)
- 5. Was David willing to obey God? (Yes!)
- 6. Why did God choose David to be king? (Because of his heart)
- 7. After David became king, what was the big promise God made to him? (That his descendants would rule forever, long after he was gone)
- 8. Who was God actually talking about when He said this? (He was talking about Jesus)
- 9. God encouraged David by telling him about this promise, how does God encourage us in our
- 10. What does knowing about the promise of Jesus mean for our lives?

ACTIVITY: Obstacle Course

WEEK 3 Solomon Builds God's Temple

1 Kings 8:1-30

God wants to be with His people.

PROLOGUE:

God love us and He desires to be with us. King David wanted to build a temple for God so there was a place for people to come and worship God. In the end, it wouldn't be King David, but King Solomon who would take on the task to build the temple. It took 7 years and was a beautiful temple to honor God. But, we know, just as Solomon knew, that God is everywhere. He is never contained to a building. His hope was that the temple would point people to God. Many years later, God came and lived among us as Jesus came to earth to save us. He came to earth because God wants to be with His people and Jesus is the only way to truly be with God.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. What was the best part of your week?
- 2. What stood out to you in today's story?
- 3. Who wanted to build the temple? Who did God have build the temple instead? (King David wanted to build it, but it was son, Solomon, who God had build the temple)
- 4. What was the purpose of the temple? (To point people to God to give them a place to come together and worship God)
- 5. What filled the temple after it was built? (A cloud which was the presence of the Lord)
- 6. Does God live in the temple? (No, God was there at the temple, but we know that God is everywhere)
- 7. How did God show us that He wants to be with us? (He sent His son to earth. Jesus came to earth to die on the cross for our sin so we can have a relationship with God)

DIGGING DEEPER FOR 4th and 5th

- 8. We know that God is everywhere, but how can we remind ourselves of that truth in our lives?
- 9. Have you ever experienced a moment you knew God was with you? What happened?

ACTIVITY: God's Presence

Materials needed: cardstock, watercolor, white crayons

- Divide supplies among the students and then instruct them to use the white crayone to write
 on their cardstock "God is EVERYWHERE" they can then decorate the paper with designs. At
 the bottom, encourage them to add "God is with us"
- Once they are finished with the white crayons, have them use the water colors to create a design and reveal what they wrote/drew on the paper

2 Kings 17:7-23

God knows what is best for us.

PROLOGUE:

We've all had moments when we've done something wrong and had to face the consequences. Whether we've been disciplined by a parent, a teacher, or a leader, we know that it is usually done out love - they know what is best for us and are helping us become better. God disciplines us to show us when we need to change our ways and follow Him because there is something better for us. Although Elijah and many other prophets were trying to call the Israelites to turn from idols and follow God, they did not repent and change their ways. As a result, they were exiled in Babylon. God did this out of love and He wanted to help them be better - they couldn't spend their lives following idols, they needed to follow God. Sometimes, God does the same thing for us because He loves us and knows what is best for us. He sees that we are doing is hurting ourselves or others and He disciplines us to guide us and lead us to a better way of living!

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS; What is something you are thankful for?

- 2. What stood out to you in today's story?
- 3. What were the Israelites doing that was wrong? (They were worshipping false idols)
- 4. Who tried to warn them to change their ways? (Prophets, including Elijah)
- 5. Did they listen? (No.) What did they do instead? (they continued to live in sin)
- 6. Do we always listen when people warn us? (no) Have you ever been hurt or gotten in trouble because you didn't listen to a warning?
- 7. Why do you think the people in our story refused to listen? (They were stubborn, didn't want to change their ways, were selfish...)
- 8. What consequence did the Israelites face as a result? (They were exiled from the land God had brought them to)
- 9. Do you think God would forgive them if they were sorry and changed their ways?
- 10. Does God provide us opportunities to change, learn and grow?
- 11. Why is it important to listen to God's warnings for our lives?
- 12. Is "God's Best" for us always the easiest? Why do you think that?

ACTIVITY: The Sabbath

Decide how you, as a family, want to try to honor the Sabbath (God's Holy Day) to rest and be together. Challenge yourselves to go without technology together for at least a few hours and take a family hike together. As you walk, talk about all the great things God has blessed your family with and give thanks God for all He has done. Make it a special day with a little more focus before another busy week begins.

WEEK 5 Review and Application

God leads us.



This month we learned about stories that remind us that God leads us. God leads us even when it is hard, God leads us because He loves us, and God always wants to be with us and lead us. For the Israelites, God led them out of Egypt and prepared a King for them with David. David was given a promise that would lead us to our ultimate king in Jesus Christ. God led His people through hard situations, God's presence was always with them, and God led His people even when they disobeyed. Through it all, we can remember that God will always lead and guide us. He is always with us and we can trust Him as we go through our lives.

- 9. What caused the Israelites to be exiled? (they were disobedient and worshipped false gods)
- 10. Why did God punish the Israelites? (Because He loves them and knows what is best for them)

ACTIVITY: Review Cartoon

Materials needed: paper, coloring supplies

- Have everyone take a piece of paper and fold it in half, then, fold it in half again.
- Open the piece of paper to reveal 4 rectangles
- · On the very center line they should write "God leads His people"
